Jesus called Simon Peter- the Rock – and asks us to respond like Peter and to worship him as the Christ, the son of the Living God! We begin our worship

The Greeting

Have you heard the good news? What good news? The good news about Jesus. I've heard of him – he speaks wise words. There's more than that – he speaks with love. He must be a prophet. He's more than that – he changes lives. He must be special. He's more than that – he's God's own Son. What should I do? Come and worship the living Lord.

Our Opening Hymn is the Servant King – thanks to Kevin for recording this for us. From heav'n You came, helpless Babe, Entered our world, Your glory veiled; Not to be served but to serve, And give Your life that we might live.

This is our God, the Servant King, He calls us now to follow Him, To bring our lives as a daily offering Of worship to the Servant King.

There in the garden of tears, My heavy load He chose to bear; His heart with sorrow was torn, 'Yet not my will but Yours,' He said.

Come see His hands and His feet, The scars that speak of sacrifice; Hands that flung stars into space To cruel nails surrendered.

So let us learn how to serve, And in our lives enthrone Him; Each other's needs to prefer, For it is Christ we're serving.

We now spend time reflecting on our need to say sorry and to hear God forgive us. Let us pray

Living God, we confess that our lives are not always ones of living sacrifice, but that more often we are bounded by conditions of our own making about how far we will go to live out our faith. **Forgive us for our lack of boldness.**

We confess that we do not always mirror your hopes of what your church will be, that we do not accept difference or change easily, that we only want to recognise each others' gifts if they are ones we want to receive. **Forgive us for our lack of openness.**

We confess that our world could be a much better place and that we could play our part in making it so. We do not challenge assumptions that injustice is inevitable and do not value the small things we can do to make a difference. **Forgive us for our lack of urgency.**

Father God, the giver of life, we offer our lives back to you. Forgive us, change us and renew us. In the name of Christ, **Amen.**

May the God of love bring us back to himself, forgive us our sins, and assure us of his eternal love in Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Prayer for Today – St Peter's Day

Almighty God, who inspired your apostle Saint Peter to confess Jesus as Christ and Son of the living God: build up your Church upon this rock, that in unity and peace it may proclaim one truth and follow one Lord, your Son our Saviour Christ, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

Peter Declares That Jesus Is the Messiah

¹³ When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say the Son of Man is?"

¹⁴ They replied, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, Jeremiah or one of the prophets."

¹⁵ "But what about you?" he asked. "Who do you say I am?"

¹⁶ Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God."

¹⁷ Jesus replied, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, for this was not revealed to you by flesh and blood, but by my Father in heaven. ¹⁸ And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it. ¹⁹ I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven."

Talk

If I put this on, what might my job be? A builder? An engineer? A scaffolder? One of those, probably. But what if I was a schoolteacher? A teacher looks the same as everyone else. A solicitor, maybe? And they also look much the same as anyone else. Unless a person wears some kind of special hat or uniform in their job, it is almost impossible to know what they do just by looking at them.

Now, I've got a question – do you think Jesus looked special? He certainly didn't wear any kind of hat or uniform to say who he was. And although some of you might be shocked at this - just looking at Jesus, he might have seemed to be like anyone else of his day.

When we read the gospels, as you can imagine, there was a lot of confusion about who Jesus really was. One day, Jesus was with his disciples and he played a little game of 'who do you think I am' with his friends

One of the disciples answered, "Some say you are John the Baptist." Because he promised the kingdom of God

"Some say you are Elijah or one of the prophets," answered another because he said what God was going to do.

Jesus questioned the disciples further, "But who do you say that I am?"

Did you notice when Ellie read the bible passage, what Peter said.

"You are the Christ," answered Peter, "the Son of the living God."

The Bible doesn't tell us, but I think that the other disciples might have cheered, "Yes, Peter! Good answer! That's what we thought all along!"

Jesus looked at Peter and said, "Blessed are you Simon, son of John, because my Father in heaven has revealed this to you. From now on, I will call you Peter (which means rock) and upon this rock I will build my church." He was pleased that Peter had worked out, not by how Jesus looked, but by what he had seen him do, and what he had heard him say - in other words he'd watched and listened carefully, that Jesus was someone special – God's son, and God's promised Christ, the one who came to rescue us and to bring us into a relationship with God. Jesus gave Peter a nickname too – wonder if you have one, something that might reflect your character or personality – what might be yours, do you think?

Peter's was 'rocky' – dependable, trustworthy – though he did let Jesus down. More importantly, as God's friends we can be part of his church, not a building but a people, to support each other, and to rely on Jesus who is our rock and fortress when things get difficult.

Jesus still asks that question today - who do you say I am? How would you answer? "He was a great teacher." Or some might say, "He was a great religious leader." That's putting the wrong hat on him, or the wrong uniform. They don't know what Peter knew. Yet when we read the bible, hear the words that Jesus spoke, and see the things that Jesus did, and see on the cross Jesus taking away our wrongs and giving to us eternal life, we can trust Father God to reveal to us what he revealed to Peter, that Jesus was no ordinary man, though that's how he might have looked, and to know Jesus as the Christ, the Son of the living God – that's an amazing truth, and one that can support us each and every day.

A short prayer. Thank you Lord Jesus that you are the Christ, the Son of the Living God. Help me to say 'yes' to you and to know this truth more and more each day. Amen.
