SESSION 5

Based on Episode 5 | Carl

Synopsis of the Episode

In this episode, Helen's brother, Daniel, arrives from Trinidad for Vernon's funeral. Not long after he arrives, he clashes with Helen's neighbour Carl, who is homosexual, and punches him. Carl calls the police and threatens to charge Daniel with a hate crime unless Daniel apologises. Daniel claims that his anger is 'righteous' and seeks Fr Michael's support. Fr. Michael attempts, but fails, to reconcile Carl, Daniel and Helen. In the end it is the bond between Helen and Carl's late mother, Brenda, that brings about reconciliation.

Suggested Bible Passage

Matthew 5.43-48

Reconciliation

Throughout the episode, Fr Michael tries time and time again to bring about reconciliation between Daniel and Carl but seems to fail.

- Why do you think his attempts to reconcile Karl and Daniel were so unsuccessful?
- And what do you think eventually allowed the reconciliation to take place?
- You might like to bring reflections into your conversation from Matthew 5.43-48.

Righteous Anger

Daniel claims that he punched Carl in righteous anger.

- Can anger ever be righteous?
- If yes, when can you call it righteous?
- Was Daniel's anger righteous?

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A world without religion

When he is talking to Fr Michael, at one point Carl said 'The world will be a better place when Catholicism and all world religions are consigned to history.'

• How would you respond, if someone said that to you?
